Outdoors play is so important for children's all round health and wellbeing, especially during the time of this coronavirus pandemic, so please take time to have a look.



To help develop our nursery garden, and to involve parents, we are holding a garden tidy-up day on Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> September. We will be planting, tidying and building new planters and raised beds during this week. We need parents help and children would love to have you in to join in this. If you could spare

an hour or so to come and join in then please ask for a time slot. Refreshments will be provided and times will be staggered so that it is not too busy.

Thank you to parents who completed our short online survey about religious and cultural celebrations. I will be in touch later in the year to discuss some of the offers made to help out with celebratory activities, including cooking, henna designs and storytelling.

Enjoy-a-Ball has been one of the activities funded through our nursery toy fund parents contribution. Unfortunately I have decided that we cannot continue with the sessions at this time due to the limitations on visiting adults, space limitations for physical activities both indoors and outdoors and the current upstairs and downstairs groupings due to COVID-19 guidance. We are therefore looking for a visiting musician to offer a series of music sessions for the children instead. If any parents have suggestions for this, I would be very happy to discuss them.

With regard to requests for changes of nursery sessions, particularly with additional invoiced hours, 4 weeks' notice is required for contract changes.

The main message remains: if your child or anyone who lives with them has a cough or temperature, your child should not come to nursery for 14 days and you should request a COVID-19 test. If the test is negative (which more than 99% of tests currently are) then they can return to nursery sooner. Only a test can confirm if a cough or fever is Covid-19 or not, despite our own feelings that it must just be a cold. If there was ever a positive case within nursery, all parents would be informed.
